Ski and Board Registration:

Ski and Board Registration is a voluntary program to build a data base of the description and serial number of equipment for Ski Park customers.

Too often people do not document the serial numbers on their equipment which makes it difficult for law enforcement to recover stolen property or return found property.

This Registration process will provide law enforcement with a data base to check on ownership, when Ski Park customers report stolen or found equipment. Officers may access the information when checking on possible stolen property.

This data base would be maintained by the Siskiyou County Sheriff's Department as a source of information. The Deputy taking a theft report would be able to enter the stolen equipment into the national stolen property system by serial number. By entering stolen property by serial number increases the possibility of your equipment being returned if stolen.

If you are from out of the county you may still register your equipment with us and have the information available to you by a phone call requesting your registration information.

Customers are advised to contact the Sheriff Explorer Advisor in charge to update the data base when there is a change of ownership of the registered equipment.

About the Explorer Program:

The Siskiyou County Multi Agency Explorer Program is sanctioned through the Boy Scouts of America, "Learning for Life" program.

The program is distinctively different from scouting. Exploring is a co-educational, young adult program developed and supervised by local law enforcement and individuals providing an opportunity for young adults to experience a particular career field.

The Law Enforcement Explorer Program is open to young men and women, 14-20 years old who desire to learn about a career in law enforcement. Explorers, learn various skills and techniques used by law enforcement and train for competitions between other explorer post. Training topics include: Traffic Control, Traffic Stops, Arrest Control, Criminal Code, Patrol Procedures, Building Searches, Crime Scene Investigation, Crisis Intervention, Report Writing, and Firearms Safety. Explorers also assist local law enforcement at special events and search and rescue operations.
